Galatians 6

Memory Verse: Galatians 6:8 (NASB95): 8 For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life.

Talking points: Verse 1-5 -What does helping a brother or sister to restoration look like? -Is this a reoccurring theme in the Bible? If so, where? -In verse 2 Paul says, "Share each other's burdens". Is he speaking one on one or is he speaking corporately? What is the difference? -What law of Christ is Paul speaking of in verse 2? -Is anybody counted out in this command?

-What does that look like in our Church family life in 2023?

-In verse 4 and 5 he talks about being focused on our own work and responsibility for it. What are the dangers of comparison in the believer's life? Who are we responsible to?
Verse 6-10
-Why is it important to provide for your Spiritual leader? Where else in the Bible can we find verses to back up your answer?
Verse 7 is a scary important verse in our Kingdom walk. To walk in victory we need to understand it.
-Is the law of sowing and reaping only about money?
-Do we only harvest righteousness, or can we harvest other less desirable things?
-Is the devil to blame for every bad thing that happens or are we eating the fruit of a seed we have sown?
-What valuable truths can you get out of verse 7 and 8 to apply to your own life?
-Verse 9 has a promise contained in it. What is the promise?
-What characteristic of God makes sure that promise is fulfilled?

Verse 11-18

-What would someone be persecuted for preaching the truth of the cross?
-What is something like a "modern day circumcision" that some in the body of Christ are trying to say are necessary.
-Why are they preaching and teaching this doctrine if it is not Biblical?
-Paul states a truth in verse 15 and the speaks a blessing in 16. Does that still pertain to today?
-After reading Galatians 6. What verses spoke the loudest to you and why?
