Talking points:

Verse 1-3

James 1:25 (NASB95): 25 But one who looks intently at the perfect law, the law of liberty, and abides by it, not having become a forgetful hearer but an effectual doer, this man will be blessed in what he does.

-After reading verse one. What are some practical steps we can use to apply this to our lives? Is it just a natural progression or does it have to be intentional?

-What is the pure spiritual milk the believer must crave and seek out to grow in his fullness?

Verse 4-8

-In verse five it describes the believer 3 ways and then tells of our purpose. What are the three things you are defined as and what is your purpose on this earth?

-What is the promise in verse 6?

-After reading verse 7-8 what are the different reactions when a believer reads the word compared to an unbeliever?

Verse 9-12

-In verse 9 it defines you 4 ways and then states your purpose. What are the four definitions and the purpose?

-After reading verse 9-10. Once you Allow those words to speak of your true definition and purpose on this earth. How should it change your perception and purpose?

-Verse 11-12 states our citizenship and warnings to what will weaken us. How can knowing our identity and citizenship help us in avoiding the pitfalls Peter warns us of ?

-What day of visitation is Peter speaking of in verse 12?

-Why are our actions and reactions so important in the marketplace and home?

-What is the fruit for the Kingdom if we follow these guidelines?

-Verse 16-17 are some awesome verses they talk about free will and direction. What does verse 16 speak of to make it so important?

-What are the four groups that are defined in verse 17? How does it differ in how we treat them?

Verse 18-20

-Do people's actions dictate our reactions or how we treat them?

-What is our source or reasoning for honoring and respecting people even when they treat us harshly and wrongly?
